Then we will dive deeper by discussing a few sections of the 2012 TAS and their application in the state of Texas and how they differ from the federal requirements. By the end of the course, we will also learn about many of the changes that have been proposed in the 2022 Texas Accessibility Standards and upcoming changes within the TDLR Elimination of Architectural Barriers program.
