From your APA President

Committees are continuing to work to provide you, as APA members, with the services that you have come to expect in the areas of training and education. The planning is well along for another great annual meeting in 2019. Take time to review the extensive progress the various committees have already made this year.

This year we are continuing the program of growth approved by the Board of Directors' planning session last March (It seems like years ago, after a busy first half of the year.) On June 28th and 29th, we met in Orlando and Miami with a core group of ADA professionals interested in establishing an APA Florida Chapter. All this has been at no cost to APA. We are planning to delay the training seminar in Florida until the first week in November, as requested by the Florida group. That same group met in August to plan their objectives and strategy for becoming the first recognized chapter of APA. We have shared our drafts of the chapter agreement for their input.

Your Board of Directors is in the process of modifying the bylaws to create chapters. With the advice of counsel, the Board hopes to have the necessary amendments and a formal chapter agreement form in place in October. Enthusiasm for the growth potential of APA is rising. We see that people in other areas are willing to participate to create a local organization for accessibility professionals linked to and with the support of APA as the national organization.

We will continue to be sensitive to the needs of the RAS community as Texas transitions to being a chapter of APA. Just as Florida and Texas share a common interest in many aspects of ADA, they also have interests specific to their state that can be addressed at the local "chapter" level. This will not happen overnight, but it will accelerate as we learn from the process, just as we have learned from the testing process.

I know we can count on many of you when we call for your help. You can be part of the next generation of APA, making it a truly national organization.


